PROGRAM UPDATES

New Therapeutic Tutoring Program coming to Chicago

Smart Love Family Services is now offering to families in the Chicago area Therapeutic Tutoring for children aged 6 – 12 years who are struggling with their core subjects. Therapeutic tutoring combines traditional academic tutoring with therapeutic responses that help students identify and acknowledge their emotions surrounding learning and school, freeing them so learning can happen. We offer parents and their children powerful and unique insights into how children's minds work and how to best tap into a child's innate desire to be successful in school and in life. Our program builds confidence and self-esteem by acknowledging all of the child's feelings and helping to preserve their inborn desire to be happy in the face of challenges.

This internship was created last year for graduate students at the beginning of their training. The Youth Group Facilitation internship is intended for minority graduate students who are interested in public service and increasing health equity.
