Renovation Underway at our New Home – the Natalie and Ben Heineman Smart Love Center



Named for Natalie and Ben Heineman, through the extraordinary generosity of Cristine Russell and Ben Heineman, Jr., the gracious prairie style home will house our highly regarded preschool, year-round gardening curriculum and family services. The property at 2222 N. Kedzie in the Logan Square neighborhood features expansive outdoor areas and a spacious light-filled interior. With the building permit secure, work began at our new home in January 2017. The first phase is demolition of several existing walls and removal of old lighting and plumbing fixtures to make way for our new layout and facelift. Our architectural firm, John Joyce and Associates, has created

new floor plans for all four floors of our 7400 sq. ft. building. It will feature three preschool classrooms, new family services and tutoring rooms, a family waiting room and an indoor play space on the lower level. New flooring, lighting, bathrooms and many additional life safety features will be added. Construction is being led by BJ Construction, owner Justin Fara. Justin and his team are envisioning a five to six month construction schedule. We anticipate opening for preschool classes in the fall.

Smart Love received over \$500,000 in lead gifts toward its campaign for a new home, providing

the funds needed to begin the facility renovation. Many generous friends of Smart Love made reaching commitments to allow the project to move forward. In the coming weeks, we will be launching a community effort to raise the final funding to bring the project to completion. We invite all to participate in this vital and historic effort.

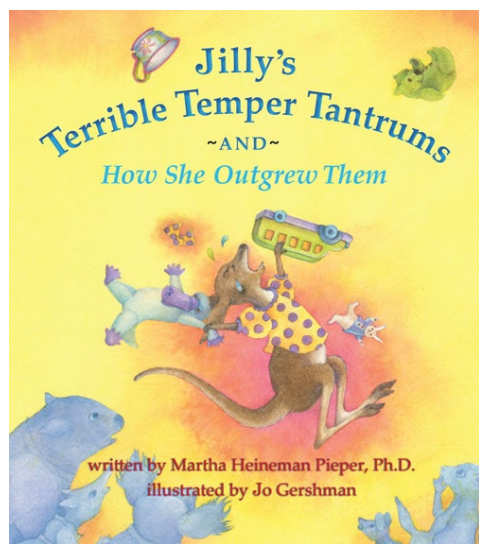
An alumni parent submitted an application to nominate Kelly in November 2016 and in the following month the Golden Apple accepted Kelly's nomination!

Dr. Martha Heineman Pieper, the co-author of Smart Love and co-developer of Intrapsychic Humanism, has written her second children's book called *Jilly's Terrible Temper Tantrums and How She Outgrew Them*. In this adorable picture book we learn about a key element of the Smart Love parenting approach—seeing the world from our child's point-of-view. This story focuses on toddlerhood's developmental stage called the "All Powerful Self"—when a toddler wants what they want when they want it. Many parents can find this stage challenging, but if we can adopt the Smart Love approach, and see the world through our children's eyes, it makes parenting much easier, pleasurable and fulfilling. 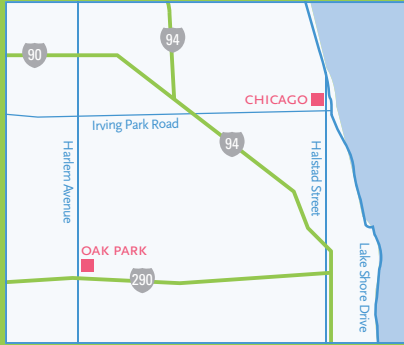

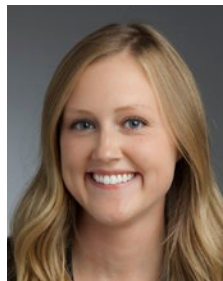

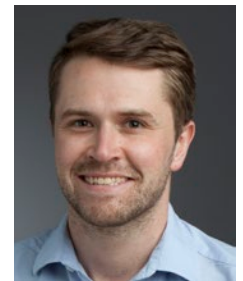
